Dear Congregants:

What Does Judaism Teach Us About Money? Friday Evening, January 15, 2010, we will worship together for our first time in the New Year.

This past year has seen a tremendous change in the economic climate of the United States and in the world. Many Americans have been suffering during this time, some facing increasingly difficult financial problems. Many have lost jobs and have been unable to regain their financial stability.

Members of our own community have experienced job losses, change in careers, and a longer waiting period in finding new employment. At the same time the economy currently is improving, and the beginnings of a recovery seem to be in progress.

On Friday evening, I will speak about Judaism and Money. What lasting wisdom does Judaism offer for real 'worth' in life. What does our tradition teach about worth - It's not about the money!

What are the commandments we should pay attention to regarding our attitude towards money? In a difficult time are we still required to give Tzedakah? Does money influence who you are? What does Maimonides say about giving?

While speaking about these matters may be interesting for an evening of worship and learning, we have to make sure that everyone knows that there is genuine pain in our community regarding this situation. We pray that those who need work will find work, and that those who are making adjustments in their lives and life styles during this time are not diminished in the eyes of the community.

There is a saying in Hebrew 'Im Eyn Kemach, Eyn Torah,' 'If there is no sustenance there is no Torah.' Please join us for services as we pray for the well-being of our community, study Torah together exploring the wisdom of our tradition. The service will be led by Beth Rubens our cantorial soloist and myself, Rabbi Arnold Saltzman

READERS' RECIPES

Banana Bundt Cake

Submitted by Andie Pfeffer

Ingredients:

- 18.25 ounce box yellow cake mix
- 1 small box vanilla instant pudding
- 3/4 cup vegetable oil
- 3/4 cup water
- 4 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon butter extract
- 1/2 cup nuts (optional)
- 2 mashed bananas

Preparation:

Mix all ingredients together for 4 to 6 minutes. Pour into greased and floured Bundt pan. Bake at 350 degrees F for 35 to 40 minutes.

Powdered Sugar Icing/Glaze

This is a very simple icing and it will glaze one 12-cup Bundt cake or a 10-inch angel food cake.

Preparation time: 5 minutes;

Cook Time: 2 minutes

Ingredients:

- 1/3 cup stick margarine or butter
- 2 cups powdered confectionary sugar
- 1-1/2 teaspoons vanilla
- 2 – 4 tablespoons water

Preparation:

Melt margarine in a saucepan. Stir in powdered sugar and vanilla. Add water, 1 tablespoon at a time, and mix until smooth and of desired consistency (a thick syrup). Drizzle over cooled cake. (This will glaze one 12-cup Bundt cake or a 10-inch angel food cake.)

Note: For a smaller Bundt cake, you may have extra icing/glaze.

Chicken Chile

Ingredients:

- Meat of one roasted chicken (pulled off bones and chopped)
- One can chicken broth
- Two cans black beans, drained
- One small can corn, drained
- One jar of salsa, medium, thick and chunky
- One third a bunch of fresh parsley or cilantro, chopped.
- Optional: chopped onion, pepper, celery, carrot, or whatever else you have on hand - I've also used frozen vegetables

Preparation:

Slow cook for one to one and a half hours and let set a half hour before serving. Serve with shredded cheese, Greek yogurt, sour cream, chives, or whatever you like. You can serve over rice, or not.
